



Course Title: OT Analysis and Group Process 102

Sub-Title: Activity Analysis

Course Description: OT Analysis and Group Process 102, Activity Analysis, is a 1-hour course designed for the clinician interested in learning more about this central aspect of occupational therapy. This course provides a description of activity analysis and the process of activity configuration and synthesis. A review of types of activity analyses, including task-focused, biomechanical, and Model of Human Occupation (MOHO), is presented. The course then moves onto cover higher level material such as describing the use of therapeutic media in activities and grading and adapting activities. At the end of this lesson, the learner will have a much deeper understanding of how to construct therapeutic activities that are appropriate to the patient's skill level.
