



Course Title: Fibromyalgia 105

Sub-Title: Differential Diagnosis: Myofascial Pain Syndrome

Course Description: Fibromyalgia 105, Differential Diagnosis: Myofascial Pain Syndrome, is a 2-hour course designed for the intermediate clinician interested in learning more about differential diagnosis related to fibromyalgia. This course will begin by presenting the criteria for a diagnosis of fibromyalgia as determined by the American College of Rheumatology. There are several other conditions and pain syndromes that have similar symptoms and feature pain and should be considered in the differential diagnosis process when determining a diagnosis of fibromyalgia. Other pain syndromes reviewed in this course include, but are not limited to: hypothyroidism, parasitic disease, metabolic insufficiencies, rheumatologic disease, whiplash, burns, psychological conditions, adult growth hormone deficiency plus more.
